On 31st August 2019, the foundation celebrated its 25th Foundations day. " It is observed that since the starting of curriculumit's more easier to engage children in different activities and focus on their holistic development as a whole while getting trained by Mobile Crèche, it helped us to get a better understanding of how to ensure those activities prepared in curriculum, followed by the worksheet as well as giving us Project coordinators and trainers. how to supervise and train children and other crèche workers, it also helped us to understand growth monitoring of children, we also observed during our Exposure visit, that children are able to identify animals and other things we taught them comfortably which made us happy that our efforts are showing in their development. Children are able to learn moral values , sharing, etc through daily activities, Crèche has now become more vibrant and more fun everyday."

Children (over 6 years either coming from crèches, or from incarcerated families) remain outside the ambit of a quality childhood and are at a risk to get influenced and drawn towards nefarious activities. Also, it has been observed that in many cases, children from incarcerated families lack any support from relatives- kith or kin due to stigma and financial constraints. Thus they are left to survive on their own. This is when India Vision Foundation takes these children under its wings and provides them with formal education through its CVF Program. The primary aim and mission of this program is to mainstream & educate the children of Incarcerated families

The Program Children of Vulnerable Families came as light at the end of the dark tunnel. It opened the doors for over 1000 children of incarcerated parents.



1996

India Vision Foundation started Children of Vulnerable Families Project with its first component, Residential School Support Model in association with Assisi Convent School. the foundation widened its reach and connected with more such institution. It has worked with 6 institutes till March 2020.



2008

The Community Support Model started in 2008, with twenty children and youth of the Bawana Community. In 2013, the project built a community center in Bawana in order to incline children towards acquiring skills, education and to learn ways to lead a healthy, happy, and righteous life.



2009

Home support Project extends supports to the needs of the children of incarcerated parents who are staying with their extended families.



2018

With a network of over 51 alumni students, the foundation has initiated a group called "Fly for Dreams (FDD)". The network engages its alumni as peer leaders who in turn engage and motivates children under the Children of Vulnerable Families Program.



Collaborating for change!



Befriending books

Books play a crucial role in a child's interaction with the outside world, and in order to cultivate reading as a habit in children and highlight the importance of good stories in developing the cognition of young readers, two projects were initiated with Children from, Home & Residential Project.





Preeti, 9 years old, associated with the project since 2016, struggled to make new friends because of her shy nature and always felt lost. During the library sessions, she got an opportunity to spend more time with her peers and was always eager to narrate the story she had read. "Through these sessions, I not only discovered my talent of story narration but I was also able to open up in front of others and make new friends. The idea of reading a book and walking into a new world fascinates me, it's a place where I can relate to the characters and adapt their qualities in my life."

Library Program with Katha

A library with 450 books from different genres was set up under its Residential Support Project at Asha Deep Foundation. Along with books, the organization also subscribed to various children's journals to help them have variety.









Ajay, 14 years associated with the project 2016, has always been curious to know about the world and its environment. While children were inclined towards reading fiction, he was the one who chose to read books about our environment. When he read Jalvayu Parivartan, he requested all his friends to sustain their old things and reuse them and plant more plants. He shared with the coordinator: "मुझे बहुत दुःख होता है जब मैं अखबार में जानवरों, पकर्षियों और वनो क नष्ट होने क बारे में पढता हूँ।अभी जब फररुअरी मेह अमेज़न रेनफॉरेसट में आग लगी थी मैं बहुत परेशान हुआ था ।मैं चाहता हूँ की मैं बड़ा होके अपने परयावरण को बचने के लिये कुछ करूँ।"

Ritu, 11 years of age, got associated with the project in 2017, when she was taken under the wings of India Vision Foundation and could not read as she never got a chance to go to school. After taking the remedial classes in the last session, she expressed: " मुझे लगता था की मैं कभी भी आगे नहीं बढ़ पाउंगी , मेरी दोसत हमेशा कक्षा मेह थरड आती है और मैं तोह कई बार पास भी नहीं हो पाती ।लेकनि पिछले साल में सुप्रिया मैडम से पढ़ने के बाद मुझे बहुत अचछा लगता है । पहले मैं बस एडिशन हीं कर पाती थी , लेकिन अब मुझे सब्सट्रैक्शन और मलटपिलकिशन भी आ गया है। एक दिन तोह सकूल में मैडम ने मेरी रीडिंग क लिए कलैपिंग भी करवाई थी। मुझे तब बहुत अच्छा लगा था।"

Library on Wheels

Foundation kick-started this initiative in the month of May 2019, where children from Home Support were given one book every month to read & review. Children were given new books as per the visit of the Home Support coordinator. The project conducted around 300 home visits from April 2019, to March 2020 and through this initiative 45 children read 50 books.

Impact: Books are children's new friends, reading books has opened doors for them into a magical world where they get the freedom to choose what they like to read about what they aspire to become. Their passion and joy while reading new books apart from their studies have helped them learn some moral & life lessons, a habit of reading and understanding that knowledge is more than their regular rote learning.

Remedial Program with Pratham

With an aim to provide quality education to the children through the means of a different curriculum at the remedial classes the project collaborated with Pratham.

It opened the doors for children who did not like to study and helped them explore an exciting world, where studies became fun and helped them learn at a great pace.









'Art is to imagine and to reach people through your imagination. When I created an artwork in the beginning, there were a lot of questions that came to my mind. What is it? How is it happening? But when I look at my finished artwork, I felt amazing." - Rozy, Class 12

I liked texture activity the most. We used different kinds of objects like jute, feather, cardboard to create textures. I thought it was all trash and I was finding the activity very hard. But now when I go through my sketchbook, I love that artwork the most. Now I feel that I can make anything I want".

The project conducted an exhibition where it exhibited the work done by the children in the last 6 months of activities as a conclusion of the project. The visitors were in awe of the creativity and talent showed by the children, they appreciated the art and encouraged children.

Creativity is contagious and we believe in passing it on.

Art Reach Program with Artreach India

The foundation collaborated with Art-Reach India's artist, Mr. Prasoon, the program aims to not only impart skills in art, but also to find hidden talent, and create a sense of emotional well-being, confidence, and happiness through creative engagement with 20 children (aged 12- 18) at the organization's Bawana Community Center.

Impact: The collaboration has widened children's perspective about art and opened an artistic door for them through which they discovered their love for art. It was amazing to see how these children were able to utilize their learnings and they used the approach of the applied art form in their school practical projects and other areas.

Children of Bawana community envisaged a developed, happy world for them with flying cars which they built through their Mural painting on the walls of the community center.



Fifteen children of the organization also got an opportunity to put up a stall at Aditi Mahavidyalaya, The University of Delhi on Diwali Mela for the same, they made beautiful artwork and decoration material during the time of Diwali and the earning through this was not just monetary, but it helped boost up their confidence and gave them a wider picture of the significance of their talent.








Happiness is to see our children doing well!

Serving a prison term, whatever the reason may be, is a very traumatic experience for inmates. Prison inmates mostly find themselves without anything productive to engage in while behind bars. This leads to a lack of personal development & employment opportunities after release. Through creative partnerships, the foundation is providing vocational training and skills development programs to male and female inmates, which will help them to seek employment or any other benefitting entrepreneurial opportunity as well as financial independence post-release.














Upcycling



A first of its kind workshop was conducted by Ms. Shagun – Art & Craft Teacher from a Primary School, Ghaziabad for females inmates of Kasna Prison. The aim of the workshop was to train inmates in upcycling plastic and create bags for their personal use.

Workshop on Book Binding and Bookmark Making



To develop the creativity and make the female inmates aware of reusing unused sheets to make such a creative notebook with less material and easily accessible as well as to make Bookmarks using unused sheets, glitters and waste materials, a two-day workshop was conducted by an external resource person Ms. Neha Singh.

One of the inmates Ramanjeet who joined us on 20 June 2019 said "मैं अपने बेटे को दिखाउंगी की उसकी माँ ने क्या बनाया है। After the workshop she visits library daily She reads newspapers daily and shares her thoughts regarding the news published with the library supervisors and other inmates who visit library"

Towards Sustainability, Going GREEN!

With the support of Give Me Trees Trust*, the Green Dasna Prison project was inaugurated in District Jail Ghaziabad. The project aims to make beneficiaries aware about the environment and for the need to conserve and protect it. The project will also help in creating a green, clean, and positive environment in prison. Under this project, the selected beneficiaries will be trained through the Give Me Trees Trust in developing Gardening Skill and in running a Nursery. The project aims to make Dasna Prison self-sustainable in producing fruits and vegetables for the prison needs, create beautiful gardens, parks, and a herbal garden.





Session on Sanitary Napkin Making



Keeping in mind female health & hygiene, the foundation initiated a session by Resource Person Ms. Jharna (Trainer Menstrual Health Activist and Educator). They were taught to make sanitary pads using the cloth.

Awareness Session



Awareness session on Degradation of the environment through plastic by Sobha Chaudhary, of Nari Shakti Woman Empower (NGO). The session aimed at creating awareness on the adverse effects of plastic and discourage females from using plastic.

Best Out Of Waste

जब मैं डासना जेल में आयी तो मैं बहुत परेशान थी और सारा दिन बैरक में रहती थी। आईवीएफ टीम की मैडम बैरक में आई और मुझे समझाया कि आपको सिलाई में आना चाहिए पढ़ना चाहिए, यदि आप आयेंगी तो आपकी बेचैनी कुछ कम होगी। फिर मैंने सिलाई सेंटर आना शुरू किया और सिलाई सीखना शुरू कर दिया। मंजू मैम ने मुझे बहुत अच्छी सिलाई सिखाई। आज, मैं खुद अपने कपड़े सिल पती हूँ और दुसरो के लिए भी सिलती हूँ, मैं अब किसी पर निर्भर नहीं हूं। मैंने जेल में रहते हुए बैंग बनाना सिखा सामान रखने के लिए, क्यों कि मेरे पास अपना सामान रखने के लिए कुछ भी नहीं था। सिलाई करने के बाद जब औरतें चली जाती मैं उनके कपड़ो की सभी कतरनों को उठा लेती थी तिक ये में भरने के लिए। पर एक दिन जब मेरे पास बहुत सारी कतरनें जमा हो गयी, तो मेरे दिमाग में एक विचार आया जो जो मेने मंजू मैडम के साथ साझा किया और मैंने उन कतरनों को जोड़ कर एक छोटी दरी बनाई इस को बनाने में मुझे चार माह लगे जिसमें सिलाई की मैडम ने मेरा पूरा सहयोग किया, दरी बनाने के बाद बहुत अच्छा लगा जेल की महिलाओ ने मेरे काम की सराहना की जिसे सुनकर मुझे खुशी होई, में इस दरी को पूजा करते प्रयोग करती हूँ और अपने घर लेकर जाउंगी मेरे इस हुनर का पूरा श्रेय इंडिया विजन फाउंडेशन और मंजू मैडम को जाता है, बहुत-बहुत धन्यवाद इंडिया विजन फाउंडेशन।" - Beneficiary from Dasna Prison associated since 2017

3 GOOD HEALTH AND WELL-BEING



In the year 2019 -20 we started a regular session by Dr Pinky Goswami, Psychologist. After her regular session, we found that the positive changes in the inmate's behavior.

Testimonial by Dr. Pinky

"In our visits to the prison(Dasna, Kasna and Gurugram), it has been noticed that the inmates, due to the very fact of arrest, were undergoing a state of trauma. The act of being sentenced, of being incarcerated into a prison system is often an unexpected turn in an individual's life - there is thus, the presence of an unexpected arrest that itself is traumatic, which can be observed in the female inmates. The severe lifestyle change, the physical boundaries and restrictions, the constant scrutiny of the prison guards, possible violence executed by the authorities in the system and the lack of individual privacy causes psychological deterioration; which include depression, anxiety, stress, recurring and negative thoughts, and various other psychological issues. In the year 2019, eighty female inmates were counseled for various psychological distress they were facing after their arrest. From these eighty inmates, the majority of the inmates, i.e. sixty inmates, were suffering from stress and anxiety due to the arrest; nine inmates were having severe anger issues or aggressive behavior; rest eleven inmates were suffering from depression, recurring thoughts, negative thoughts, lack of awareness or severe trauma. Counseling and therapies are going on and are in process. Progress is seen in fifty percent of the female inmates."


